

Pitmedden Garden for schools

Pitmedden Garden was founded in 1675 by Sir Alexander Seton with the creation of the Great Garden. It is part of a 100-acre estate featuring a variety of attractions, including woodland, ponds and a wildlife garden.

A Museum of Farming Life has been established and features implements and buildings chronicling farming in the area.
